FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the SF Camerawork Exhibition Award?

The SF Camerawork Exhibition Award is an open call for curatorial proposals by artists, collectives, and independent curators working with photography and related media. The selected exhibition will be exhibited in SF Camerawork's spacious downtown San Francisco gallery, and receive the inaugural SF Camerawork Exhibition Award --which includes a \$5,000 project grant plus shipping, installation, technical, marketing, and community engagement support.

How is the SF Camerawork Exhibition Award different from Forecast 2020?

The SF Camerawork Exhibition Award is a call for project proposals substantially realized and prepared for a significant exhibition in January 2021. Forecast 2020, our annual survey exhibition, is a call for photographic work to be juried and curated into an exhibition at SF Camerawork in the summer 2020.

How should artist costs and stipends be factored into the budget proposal?

Your \$5,000 budget proposal should include all artist costs (i.e. printing, framing, travel, stipends).

We recommend the following minimum stipends as established by W.A.G.E. (wageforwork.com)

Solo Exhibition Artist Fee: \$1000

2-Person Exhibition \$500/Artist

Group Exhibition, 3 - 5 Artists \$250/Artist

Exhibitions of 6+ Artists, \$150 per artist.

Exhibition Curator Fee: \$1000

What is required in the application?

All applicants are required to submit a narrative exhibition proposal, project budget, and selection of 10 sample images.

Can multiple artists/curators submit a joint application?

Yes, a group of artists or curators can submit a joint application.

Is there a fee to submit the application?

Yes, there is a \$10 fee to submit an application for the SF Camerawork Exhibition Award.

What are the dimensions/floor plan of the gallery space?

SF Camerawork's expansive gallery is approximately 2,000 square feet.

How will the awarded artist be selected?

The awarded applicant will be selected following review by SF Camerawork Executive Director, Heather Snider, and the SF Camerawork Programming Committee.

When are proposals due?

All proposals are due by Friday, March 6th, 2020, 11:59 PM PST. Late proposals will not be considered.

When will the awarded project be exhibited?

The awarded project will be exhibited at SF Camerawork's gallery space in January 2021.

How long will the awarded exhibition be on view?

The exhibition will be on view for 2 - 3 months.
